



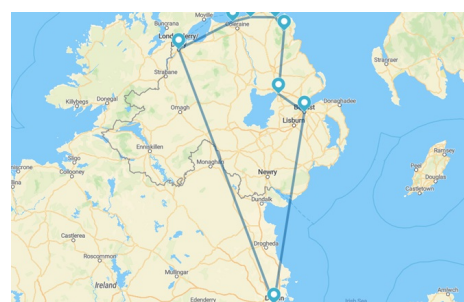

Here you'll find the recently opened Game of Thrones Studio Tour, the world's first behind-the-scenes tour based on the famous HBO series that promises to transport visitors to the very heart of Westeros through fascinating attractions, impressive sets, costumes and accessories, as well as digital content from state-of-the-art and interactive materials.

We have devised a fascinating road trip where a legendary map from fiction overlaps the real-world map to take you on a journey through an insane and astonishing series of jaw-dropping landscapes, amazing legends, historic castles, ruined abbeys, menacing forests, breathtakingly sheer cliffs, volcanic basalt corridors made for giants, picturesque harbours and remote beaches. Head for enigmatic Winterfell and get ready for an experience that wouldn't be out of place in a film. The 'Northern Ireland Game of Thrones Tour' is a magical journey that takes you to the heart of the Seven Kingdoms and some of the most extraordinary spots on the Emerald Isle. It's also the perfect excuse to explore one of the most beautiful and authentic corners of Europe at your own pace. On your road trip, you'll see some of the most memorable places in the series, including the Mourne Mountains, Tollymore Forest Park, Inch Abbey, Castle Ward, Cushendun Caves, the Glens of Antrim and Ballintoy Harbour. We'll wind along the Causeway Coastal Route, one of the most beautiful driving routes in the world. There we'll see the legendary Giant's Causeway, a natural wonder with UNESCO World Heritage status. And for urbanites, we'll round off our trip with visits to Dublin (Republic of Ireland), Belfast and Derry/Londonderry, three of the most vibrant and interesting cities on the Emerald Isle. Come to Ireland and discover a parallel universe divided into four continents and Seven Kingdoms. Sharpen your sword, adjust your shield strap and go forth on a journey to the real-world Westeros! You'll never want to leave. The itinerary includes some places that don't appear in Game of Thrones, but which we think are unmissable because of how important and spectacular they are.

● DAY 1 · CITY OF ORIGIN - DUBLIN

Flight departure from the city of origin to Dublin and rental car pick-up. This fascinating road trip through Ireland begins in its lively capital city. Dublin is one of Europe's oldest cities and strikes a perfect balance between a great medieval and Georgian heritage and modern buildings, fine cafes, cutting-edge restaurants and interesting art and design attractions. You'll have the rest of the day free to get a feel for the city; enjoy the local cuisine and try an authentic Irish coffee, walk in the footsteps of important writers such as James Joyce and Oscar Wilde, and discover unique places like Dublin Castle, the legendary Trinity College, the historic Christ Church and St. Patrick Cathedrals and the Bank of Ireland... At Dublin City Hall, the old Royal Exchange, you can take in the 'Story of the Capital' exhibition, a fascinating display which will immerse you in the city's history. In the late afternoon, cross the Ha'penny Bridge and explore the fabled Temple Bar area on the banks of the River Liffey. Check out the nightlife of this universal city by popping into its historic pubs and savouring a dark and bitter Guinness beer. Overnight stay in Dublin.

● DAY 2 · DUBLIN - MOURNE MOUNTAINS - TOLLYMORE FOREST PARK - INCH ABBEY - CASTLE WARD - QUINTIN BAY - BELFAST

Your adventure through Westeros will begin in County Down at the foot of the Mourne Mountains (in Leitrim Lodge). This green oasis was one of the primary settings as Sansa and Littlefinger travelled to the Eyrie while Brienne and Pod watched them from afar. As we continue along our route, we'll come to the Tollymore Forest Park after around 30 minutes. As you stand amidst its lush vegetation, hidden caves and Gothic gateways and bridges, it's easy to imagine the three men from the Night's Watch riding toward the Haunted Forest to confront the fearsome White Walker, Theon's escape and his subsequent capture by Ramsay Snow or Bran's meeting with the three-eyed raven that he sees in his dreams... Continuing along the route for another hour, we come to Inch Abbey. Eight hundred years old, the abbey has witnessed some of the series' most moving moments. You'll be walking through a legendary place where Catelyn Stark learnt of Ned's death, Jaime was captured and Robb was crowned King. We'll then venture to the west and, after 15 minutes in the car, we'll come to the fabled Castle Ward, the location chosen to bring Winterfell, the home of the Starks, to life. You'll be standing before one of the series' most epic settings. This 18th century property, belonging to the National Trust, saw the arrival of Robert Baratheon and his court and served as a refuge for Robb Stark's army on its journey towards The Twins. If you have time, you can take a trip to the beautiful beaches dotted along the coastline. Gems such as Quintin Bay have served as inspiration for the famous series. At dusk, we'll head to the city of Belfast where you'll be able to enjoy the nightlife. Overnight stay in Belfast.

● DAY 3 · BELFAST (OPTIONAL ACTIVITY: GAME OF THRONES STUDIO TOUR / BANBRIDGE)

Today we recommend combining the city tour with the amazing Game of Thrones Studio Tour, a gigantic interactive theme park of more than 33,000 m² that is the first in the world dedicated to the acclaimed series. You'll find it at the Linen Mill Studios in Banbridge, the original filming location. (Note: The theme park is about half an hour's drive from Belfast). It will transport you to the very heart of Westeros with stunning visuals, captivating sets, and original elements that make up the fabulous Game of Thrones universe! More experiences for lovers of the series? Belfast was a location hotspot for the series. In The Dark Horse pub, in the Cathedral Quarter, you can see one of the doors from Game of Thrones. At sunset, you can continue discovering the fascinating culinary and leisure activities found in this vibrant city. Overnight stay in Belfast.

● DAY 4 · BELFAST - CAIRNCASTLE - SHILLANAVOGY VALLEY - CUSHENDUN CAVES - GLENS OF ANTRIM - MOYLE

Our day will begin with a visit to the interactive Titanic Belfast museum. Some of the most famous scenes from Game of Thrones were filmed next door in the Paint Hall (Titanic Studios). After learning about the history and charm of this evolving city, we'll continue our journey by moving north. Our first stop will be Cairncastle, a key location in the very first episode of the series. It was exactly here that Ned Stark drew his sword, Ice, and cut off the head of a Night's Watch deserter before the astonished eyes of Jon, Bran, Robb and Theon. Our next stop is the nearby Shillanavogy Valley. Its lush green valleys were transformed into the rolling prairies of Vaes Dothrak where fierce Dothraki troops set up camp. After enjoying this gem of nature, we'll continue to the northeast until we reach the spectacular coastline of Antrim, specifically the Cushendun Caves. This unique place was chosen as the filming location for the scene in which Melisandre gives birth to the monstrous shadow baby which went on to kill Renly. If you have time, we recommend visiting the Glens of Antrim and exploring Glenariff, also known as the Queen of the Glens. The largest of the nine Glens of Antrim, Glenariff was the setting for the duelling practice at Runestone, where Littlefinger and Sansa Stark watched Robin Arryn's weak attempts at fighting. If hiking is your thing, we highly recommend the Forest Park walking trails. Our last stop on this unforgettable day will be the gorgeous coastal town of Ballycastle. There you will be able to venture down the iconic Kingsroad from Game of Thrones. Explore the disturbing Dark Hedges! An evocative avenue of beech trees which, according to local legend, has its very own resident ghost. It's a magical place. Overnight stay in Moyle and surroundings.

● DAY 5 · MOYLE - CAUSEWAY COASTAL ROUTE (BALLYCASTLE - BALLINTOY - LARRYBANE - CARRICK-A-REDE ISLAND AND BRIDGE - GIANT'S CAUSEWAY - OLD BUSHMILLS DISTILLERY - DUNLUCE CASTLE - PORTSTEWART BEACH - MUSSENDEN TEMPLE - BINEVENAGH MOUNTAIN - DERRY - LONDONDERRY)

Let's get ready to explore the north of Westeros. The stunning Causeway Coastal Route boasts sublime landscapes, extraordinarily beautiful coastline, historic castles, breathtaking ravines and lively cities which are worth taking your time to visit. Get ready to walk through exhilarating natural settings! After a stroll around the remote and picturesque Ballintoy Harbour, Theon's landing place upon his return to the Iron Islands, we'll move on to Larrybane, our starting point for our climb to the Carrick-a-Rede rope bridge. A one-kilometre paved trail will lead you to the legendary bridge that crosses over to the small island of Carrick-a-Rede. Built by local fishermen to access the island, the bridge is suspended over an abyss of up to 30 metres with rough seas at the bottom. Do you dare to cross it? With that thrilling experience complete, we'll head to the legendary Giant's Causeway, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. According to popular legend, the 40,000 basalt columns that shape this path which vanishes into the ocean are the work of fearsome giants. In the land of the Westeros, anything is possible. We'll now continue our fascinating journey. If you have time and are curious about how whiskey is made, you can visit the Old Bushmills Distillery, the world's oldest. Back on the coast, you'll be struck by the awe-inspiring sight of the 14th century Dunluce Castle. Built on the edge of a cliff, it looks as though it could collapse into the raging waves at any moment... On the way to the historic city of Derry Londonderry, you can stop off at the iconic Mussenden Temple. Here Melisandre burned the Seven Gods of Westeros in honour of R'hllor, Portstewart Strand beach where Jaime and Bronn, disguised as Martell soldiers, approached the gates of the Water Gardens, and Binevenagh mountain... This is where our epic foray into the real-world Westeros comes to an end. We'll have travelled from one corner of the Seven Kingdoms to the other. As the evening falls we'll arrive in Derry-Londonderry, one of the few completely-walled cities left in Europe. After nightfall, there is entertainment to be had by visitors in the city's traditional pubs, cask culture, fine restaurants and renowned nightlife complete with jamming sessions in the early hours of the morning and buzzing nightclubs. Overnight stay in Derry-Londonderry.

● DAY 6 · DERRY-LONDONDERRY AND SURROUNDING AREA

Within its magnificent 17th-century walls, the lively city of Derry-Londonderry amazes visitors with its labyrinthine alleys, streets, pubs, shops, restaurants and attractions of every kind which make this, one of Ireland's most culturally compelling cities, the perfect finishing point for the 'Northern Ireland Game of Thrones Tour'.

During your visit to the city, don't forget to head to the Tower Museum to learn all there is to know about the history of the city, from pre-Hispanic times to the modern day.

If you fancy an extra outing, we recommend paying a visit to the golden beaches of Portrush or the ancient (it is estimated to be 9000 years old) Mount Sandel Fort settlement, which is under two kilometres away from the university town of Coleraine.

Overnight stay in Derry-Londonderry.

● DAY 7 · DERRY-LONDONDERRY - DUBLIN

It's time to leave historic Derry-Londonderry and return to the Republic of Ireland's vibrant capital city. Living on in our memory will be spectacular natural settings and secret spots used to bring George R.R.Martin's novels to our television screens. Even a brief 5-day visit is enough for us to surrender to Northern Ireland's charms. With us we'll take everlasting memories of the vast richness of its culture, landscapes and cuisine tucked safely away in the Seven Kingdoms of Ireland. Once in Dublin, we'll immerse ourselves in its compelling culture and its countless bars and traditional pubs, green parks, sweeping shopping streets and dozens of museums. This will undoubtedly be the crowning moment of a trip worthy of a film. Overnight stay in Dublin.

● DAY 8 · DUBLIN - CITY OF ORIGIN

Important remarks

- Triple rooms in Europe are generally rooms with twin beds or a double, in which a folding bed is installed to accommodate the third person. Due to the inconvenience this causes, we advise against using this option as far the possible.
- Check-in time at the hotel on the day of arrival depends on each establishment, but in no case will it be before 3:00 p.m., unless otherwise indicated.
- From 5 March 2025, it is mandatory to obtain an ETA Electronic Travel Authorisation in advance and online to enter the United Kingdom. This form must be obtained through the website Apply for an electronic travel authorisation (ETA) - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk).
- The proposed excursions and tours for each day are purely suggestions, as you can tailor the trip to suit your times, tastes and needs.
- A credit card is considered a guarantee, so sometimes you will need one for check-in at hotels.
- Hotels usually have cots available. Otherwise, babies will have to share a bed with an adult.
- To pick up your rental car, you'll need a credit (not debit) card in the name of the person who made the booking, who must also be the named driver of the vehicle.
- Consult the necessary documentation to enter the destinations visited and for transit in the countries where air stopovers are made.
- This itinerary has been developed in collaboration with the Irish Tourist Office.
- Scenarios have been included that do not appear in Game of Thrones, but that are considered indispensable by its importance and spectacularity.
